

Fifth Sunday of Easter

Reading I: Acts 6: 1-7

From the very beginning Christ's church took special care of the poor, especially widows who no longer had a husband to be their protector. It wasn't something they just decided to do. They learned it by years of watching how Jesus always gave preferential treatment to the poor among them, with special attention to women and children.

Reading II: 1 Peter 2: 4-9

The second reading places Jesus at the very foundation of who we are to be as people of God. We are the new living temple and Jesus our cornerstone who claims us his own.

Gospel: John 14: 1-12

As if to reinforce the first two readings, Jesus reminds us that HE is the way and that we should always follow him by living our lives in imitation of his life. If we are ever in doubt of what to do, Jesus' life is our template.

Challenge for the Week:

At dinner this evening, share with one another what it means to you personally to live as Jesus did, caring for those in need.

I have been doing some major housecleaning. Now, my husband and I have only been in this home since 2001. Before that, we had to clean out 35 years worth of 'stuff' from our previous home! For most of it we were glad to finally pitch it. However, for some of it, it was gut-wrenching. It was so difficult to let go of the cribs, walkers, bouncy chairs, wind-up swings, and all the darling little outfits so meticulously packed away that had turned yellow and dingy any way. But, once we did it and moved to our present home, we vowed that we would <u>never</u> do that again. We would keep up with the junk and not be hoarders. But...always the but...here I am going through closets and boxes that have been crammed into every available space in our home. However, I have a really good reason. No, I'm not moving out....my mom is moving in. She's been leery of it but I am strangely excited. Now I get a chance to do for her what she did for me....take care of her.

One of my favorite pictures of my mom is one I found when I was doing all that cleaning when we moved from our first home. It was taken at a dinner and in it were my two cousins, their mom, my sister and I, my mom and her sister!! At the time it took my breath away!

When I was child this particular group of women got together often, but for many, many years now it has not been so easy. My mom looked particularly happy in the picture. Her sister is her last sibling living and my aunt her last sister-in-law. She was fairly beaming. I still remember how I felt as I gazed at all those smiling faces. If it wasn't for my mom, I wouldn't have been sitting there reliving my own life filled with memories of my own children and grandchildren. Because of that tiny, little woman (only 5'2") dedicating her life to raising my sister, brother and me and giving us a wonderful, love-filled home, I am able to pass on that legacy to my own family. I was especially overwhelmed with love and gratitude for her in that moment. And I am so grateful to God that she is my mother. I am very much like her and she is very much like many of the women God has given us as our own ancestors in faith.

There are many examples in Scripture, though we rarely hear their stories proclaimed on Sundays. There was Deborah, an Old Testament judge, who led an army to protect her people. Ruth, a direct ancestor of Jesus, was a woman of fierce loyalty to her family, leaving all she knew to follow them into the unknown. The mother of the Maccabee brothers was a source of encouragement for her sons' bravery when they were faced with dire adversity and Esther and Judith were queens who put their lives on the line to save their people.

For many of us, we may be more familiar with the New Testament women: besides Mary, Jesus' mother, and Mary Magdalene, we have Phoebe, a deaconess of the early Church who spent her life helping those in need, and Lois and Eunice, a mother and daughter who passed on their faith in Christ to their children. There was also Chloe, a leader who was entrusted by Paul with one of his important letters to deliver to a community anxious for his words. All resilient women gifted by God with strengths and virtues that have been passed down through the ages to all of us as models to emulate. I know God has graced my mother with many of those virtues, as I am sure God has graced your mother as well. May we always remember them and may we always be blessed by their lives.

2017-18 Registration Information

Registration materials for the 2017-18 Religious Education classes have been mailed, and by now, you should have received the information. Both new and returning families need to register for next year.

For 2017-18, we will continue to offer Catechetical sessions which begin after Labor Day and end in May 2018. We also offer the 2-Week Summer Intensive Program which is for grades 3 – 6 and will meet June 12-23. The deadline for returning your completed registration with payment is June 30. However, the deadline for Summer Intensive registration is May 31 and there is limited enrollment.

Tuition must be paid in full at the time of registration. We accept cash or check. Credit card payments or direct debit from your checking or savings account are only available on-line, through the Give Central website.
