

EPIPHANY...

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of Our Lord. This celebration recalls the visit of the magi to the infant Jesus. Rich in symbolism, at the heart of the Epiphany, is the message that God's salvation has come for all peoples. The foreigners traveled from a great distance to worship the new born King. Their presence demonstrates the wideness of mercy and love. Far too often, we fall into the trap of thinking narrowly, creating an 'us versus them' mentality. And yet the Gospel message is about "them and us." Our faith is always about building bridges. The challenge is for us to open our minds and hearts to embrace all peoples. Today, manifested by the visit from distant travelers, our Lord welcomes all peoples. May we, no matter how difficult at times it may be, learn to do the same; setting aside our own prejudices to see others as brothers and sisters in the Christ Jesus.

CHRISTMAS CONCLUDES...

After the shortest season of Advent possible, we now similarly have a brief Christmas Season. Christmas in the Church concludes tomorrow with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. While many have seen Christmas 2017 as a distant memory, the Church continues our celebrating of the message of Christ's coming into the world. Each year, the Christmas Season concludes with the Baptism of the Lord, inaugurating Christ's ministry and at the same time reminding us of our Baptismal call to share in Christ's ministry. Tuesday, we will begin Ordinary Time, the counted weeks of the year until it is interrupted with the Season of Lent which begins on Wednesday, February 14th.

EPIPHANY BLESSING

There is a tradition, in the Church, of blessing our homes on the Epiphany. The blessing is simple and



accompanied by the ritual of marking the lintel of the door in chalk with the following symbols: 20 + C + M + B + 18. The numbers obviously are in reference to the calendar year 2018. The + remind us of the cross of Christ. The letters: C,M & B have a double meaning; first the traditional names of the three wise men (Casper, Melchior and Balthazar), as well as the Latin dictate *Christus manionem benedictat* (May Christ bless the house).

So gather your family and offer this prayer today:

The three Wise Men, Casper, Melchior and Balthazar followed the star of God's Son who became human two thousand and seventeen years ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout the new year. Amen.

Now mark the door with the symbols in chalk and then pray:

Visit, O blessed Lord, this home with the gladness of your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love; and grant that we may manifest your love to each other and to all whose lives we touch. May we grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of you; guide, comfort, and strengthen us in peace, O Jesus Christ, now and forever. Amen.

The Epiphany of Our Lord

We Three Kings of Orient are
Bearing gifts we traverse afar

Representing all the nations of the non-Jewish world, the Magi recognize the Messiah, echoing Psalm 98, "All the ends of the earth have seen the power of God."

From tradition, we name the Three Kings Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar and write their names over the doors of our homes to bless all who enter in the new year:

$$20 + C + B + M + 18$$

In this new year may we recognize the many opportunities for peace-making that present themselves to us. May peace reign in our hearts, in our homes, in our nation, and in our world.

God being One of Us...

This year has moved waaaaay too fast. It is hard to believe but we will be on the countdown to Ash Wednesday and into Lent before you know it. Sometimes I feel that the grand march of time is being trekked ever faster, but maybe it's just because I'm getting older much faster than I want to!! It makes it very apparent to me that it is ever more important that I pay attention to the moment and not let it slip away because I'm looking forward (or worse, backward!). I need to be on guard to constantly be open to what it is God wants me to know, what truth God is trying to reveal to me. And these days, that often is quite difficult because at my age I sometimes display an amazing stubbornness to accept a different version of a 'truth' that I thought I had down pat. That may stem from the fact that I grew up in a household where "we do this because this is the way our family has always done it." So there has always been a certain inflexibility in my thinking. BUT, I thank God that alongside the certitude of family tradition, I was also raised with the idea that we should not go through life with blinders on, seeing only that old, familiar road in front of us. Therefore, over the years, I have acquired a certain 'rhythm' to ascertaining what I think God is trying to tell me. It's a gentle ballet between dancing in place just long enough to become really familiar with a particular step and then stretching outward to a new, as yet undiscovered interpretation of the music...God's music. It's more challenging, but in the end, a much more fruitful way of developing my relationship with God.

Which brings me to the Magi, those men who perfected the art of the dance. I'm sure as they scoured the heavens they felt comfortable, thinking they understood what they were looking at.....until a comet, or an undiscovered planet—or a strange, new star—was observed. Then they found themselves entertaining new possibilities and somewhere inside themselves they found the courage to search out what those possibilities could be. We don't know how long it took them to travel to Bethlehem. We don't know if they ever doubted the decision to move into the unknown. We don't even know for sure if there were two, three, or ten of them. We only know what they found. That God, the God of all creation, had become one of us... for all of us. Up until that time, everyone thought that God was only God for their particular people. The Jews thought God was only for them and he lived in the temple....the Eastern folk thought they were the only ones who knew the true path to spiritual enlightenment....and the Romans knew God as just a convenience in fulfilling whatever it was the State wanted. The idea that God loved everyone fully and equally, no matter what their race, was an absurdity. But one cool evening in a manger a child was presented to some foreigners who revealed it was different. God chose to take on flesh—our flesh—and become a human being. He will forever be one of us, with us, and for us. All of us.

St. Vincent de Paul Society is a group of dedicated volunteers who meet to assess and respond to the needs of the people in our community. The people we serve do not need to be Catholic, only live within our boundaries or be a member of our parish. Members of SVDP visit with individuals or families to first determine if or how they may be of service. If a situation demands, emergency assistance can be approved, food or shelter provided or offered. Temporary or short term assistance is also available. All cases are reviewed at semi-monthly meetings of the members St. Vincent de Paul. In addition, during the summer months, SVDP members prepare and serve dinner at a local Pads shelter.

What is an Active Parishioner?

In theory, any soul who resides in the canonical boundaries of a parish is considered a parishioner. Today, many parishioners reside beyond the given canonical boundaries. What then does it mean to be an active parishioner. Here are some guidelines used in the distinction of "active parishioner."

- An "active parishioner" is defined as someone who is properly registered. Adult children living at home are strongly encouraged to register separately from their parents as parishioners.
- An "active parishioner" attends Mass regularly on Sundays and Holy Days.
- An "active parishioner" participates in a ministry of the Church.
- An "active parishioner" supports the parish through sacrificial giving either via envelope or online giving.
- An "active parishioner" participates in parish activities whenever possible.

The above criteria help us to testify to one's suitability to serve as a godparent for Baptism or sponsor for Confirmation.

Registration can be done online via stjulie.org or visiting the Parish Office during normal business hours.


