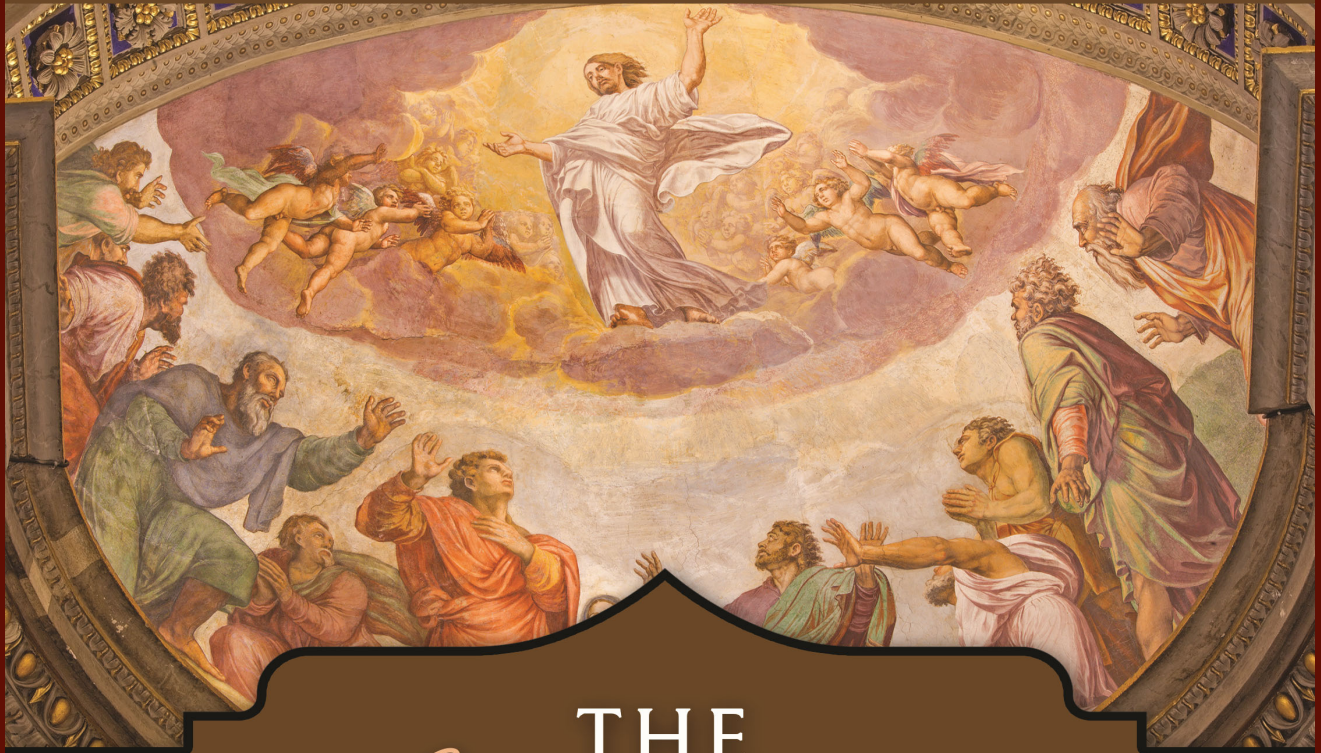

**ASCENSION OF THE LORD...**

Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. Having completed His mission of salvation, Jesus ascends to God's eternal kingdom, leaving us the task to take up the proclamation of the Gospel of salvation. We are sent by the Lord to proclaim to 'every creature' that God has saved us.

In considering this feast, I think that we often focus first on Jesus ascending; almost to the extent that it seems secondary to His commission to us. Perhaps we get it wrong - that is to say that the primary focus is our being "MISSIONED" and the supporting reality is Jesus' ascension. The Lord has completed his mission, ours has only begun. That's why I love the image from our first reading, when the disciples are asked "why are you standing there looking at the sky?" So I ask each one of us: Why are you standing there waiting for Jesus to do your mission, your witnessing to the Gospel? I would go so far as to suggest that those who simply lament that fewer people go to Mass; that less people have an interest in faith, in God - are like the disciples waiting for Jesus to do something. Rather, let us take up the mission, let us live up to our discipleship; let us go out and preach the Good News. It is the Ascension of the Lord; Jesus truly ascends when we proclaim the Gospel!

MOTHER'S DAY...

Today, in the United States, we also celebrate Mothers' Day. On this day, we recognize the vocation of motherhood and give thanks for all the women in our lives who have nurtured, challenged and loved us. It is always a great day to use the words that we often neglect to share: Thank you mom! I love you mom! God bless you mom! We all have terrific models of motherhood in our lives and we can never forget the tremendous contributions that mothers, grandmothers, sisters, female friends have made to shaping our character. Today, really it should be every day but especially today, we give thanks to God for the "mothers" who have given us so much. Happy Mothers Day!

**PRIESTHOOD ORDINATION AND ANNIVERSARIES...**

Next Saturday, May 19th, the Archdiocese of Chicago will ordain eight men to the priesthood. I look forward to participating in this important moment of their lives both by presenting them

their Archdiocesan Stoles on Friday, and then being one of the priests to officially welcome them to the presbyterate during the ordination. MASS TIME SURVEYS...

This week, we have been busy reviewing all the surveys submitted as we consider a change in our schedule of Masses. Again, after consultation with the staff, conversation among neighboring pastors and consideration with the Dean, we'll soon have a decision on our new schedule. I do want to clarify two things that seem to surface from survey comments. First, the easy one, there will be a Saturday evening Mass and Sunday evening Mass. The intention is not to lose either of those opportunities, but to see if there is 'ground swell' interest in different times. Secondly, the concern of "giving up" on getting an associate pastor is unfounded. I am not giving up; in fact, I'm hopeful that perhaps next year we will get an associate pastor. There is no guarantee that will be the case, but there is hope. The unfortunate reality is that we won't get an associate at this time. The number of priests continues to diminish, and it's not as if we can run down to the "priests' store" and simply get an associate. We do have to face this reality now, which is why the matter of changing Mass times has become a necessity.

**Love one another
as I have loved you...**

One Sunday morning many years ago I was reading my newspaper and drinking coffee. It was one of those really cold January days that was cloudy gray, overcast and really, really cold. The phone rang suddenly and I wondered who could be calling so early (it was around 7am). A friend I had grown up with was on the other end. "Hi, Judi," I said. Without taking a breath, she simply said, "Larry died last night." Dummy me asked, "Larry who?" She replied it was Larry, her sister, Sandy's, husband. I was dumbfounded. I shakily stammered out the usual questions of where and how? It just hadn't occurred to me that it could be anyone I was so close to, had spent high school years with and was raising our respective children together with. Larry and Sandy lived across the alley from me so besides growing up together with Sandy and her sister, Judi, we had spent all our adult lives continuing to grow up together!

I was in shock. Larry was only 49. It was unimaginable to me that this had happened. I quickly hung up and got dressed as fast as I could. Running out the door, I shouted at my husband to take care of the kids and I would be home when I got home.

Reaching Sandy's back door took seconds and without any words we just hugged each other. The three of us, Sandy, her sister and I literally have known each other from the womb. Our mothers were best friends (and still are). I spent several hours with her and her family that morning before heading home to 'marshal the forces.' My husband's job was to make a pot of spaghetti sauce with sausage and peppers for sandwiches. My job was to contact my sister and brother and give each of them a task, either cooking or helping out at the wake or serving food the day of the funeral. All of our jobs were to assist our friends

in whatever they needed during this dark time.

How did I know what to do? I actually learned it from them. When my grandmother died when I was a teenager, Sandy and her sister and mother cooked and served the funeral luncheon for my whole family (and I have a huge Italian family!). This was back in the sixties when luncheons were held in the home rather than going out to a restaurant. So instead of attending my grandmother's funeral (who was Sandy's godmother), they honored her memory by ministering to her family. And besides all the wonderful, comforting food they fed us, they also fed us Eucharist. I didn't know it at the time or call it that, but over the years, as I continue to learn what it means to live out the gospel, I know that that is what they did for us that day so long ago. They gave of themselves just as Jesus gives of himself.

Jesus tells us today, "love one another as I have loved you." Not the old testament law of love your neighbor as yourself, but the NEW command to love your neighbor as **Jesus** loves your neighbor. Much more challenging.

My friends did that. They literally emptied themselves of their own need to mourn for my grandmother by coming to her funeral mass and instead followed that command by serving us. They loved us just like Jesus loved us. Even though that happened so long ago, it is an example they gave me that I hope I have given to my own children so when the time comes, they will know how to love as Jesus loves and be able to marshal the forces, too.

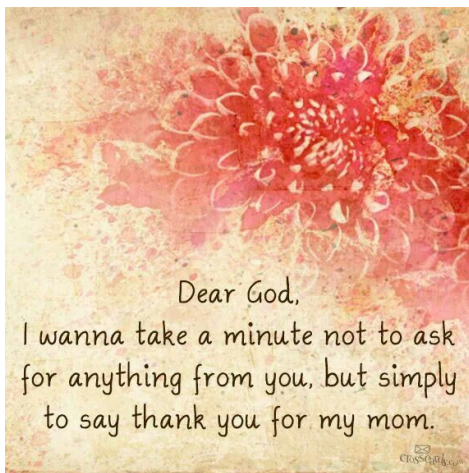

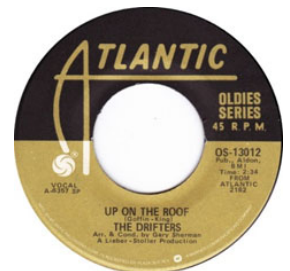
