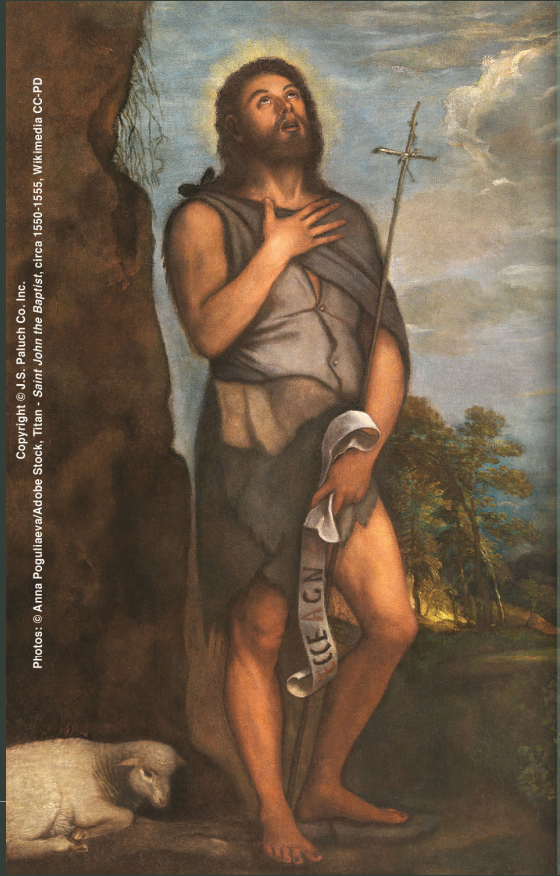

SOLEMNITY OF THE NATIVITY OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST...

This year, one of the realities of our liturgical calendar is that this Sunday we celebrate an annual feast day which is not well known. By the fact that June 24th falls on Sunday, this Solemnity replaces the regular Sunday of Ordinary Time. Our Scriptures on the feast focus our attention once again on the great figure of St. John the Baptist. John, also known as the Precursor, spends his life pointing to the presence of Jesus in our world and in our lives. He leaps for joy in his mother Elizabeth's womb as she hears of the impending birth of Mary's Son, Jesus. He is the voice crying out in the wilderness pointing to the "Lamb of God," the Messiah.

Ultimately, he gives his life for Jesus, as he witnesses in his own blood as a martyr to Jesus' coming for our salvation. John is a great figure in our salvation history. Reminiscent of our questions: Where do I see Jesus in my life? Where do I need Jesus in my life? Where do I share Jesus in my life? John serves as a patron saint for our efforts to evangelize. Like him, we see, need and share Jesus. Let us recognize in this feast day, our own calling to announce the

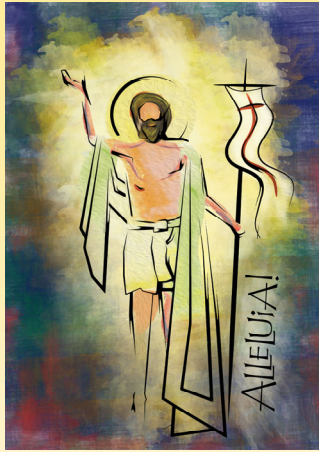

A Reflection on Our Relationship with Jesus

Where do you see Jesus in your life?

In our hearts, at church, when we say our dinner prayers.

Where do you need Jesus in your life?

When we are scared, during a test, when we are sad, when we get hurt.

Where do you share Jesus in your life?

With your family, at you sport events, at school, and by being kind to an excluded student.

SEE JESUS - NEED JESUS - SHARE JESUS

I am an evangelizing disciple!

We invite all parishioners to think about their relationship with Jesus by looking at three questions:

- Where do I see Jesus in my life?
- Where do I need Jesus in my life?
- Where do I share Jesus in my life?

As the Lord's disciples today, we are called to be 'evangelizers' who share our faith in Jesus. Under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, we have begun sharing our responses to these questions. Your fellow parishioners have begun submitting their responses which we will publish in the bulletin. This, of course, is one way to 'share Jesus,' but the hope is much broader than simply publishing some brief reflections. Rather, the hope is to inspire our community to see Jesus, to help those who need Jesus, and to share Jesus in our community - to become more of an evangelizing Church. As you read the weekly reflection, perhaps it will help you find Jesus in your own life experiences and then encourage you to share your experience.

Liturgical Texts

We know that God is delighted by our prayer, praise, and petition. This is one of the reasons we gather each Sunday.

When we are making decisions about our common prayer, there are several documents which instruct us with regard to the liturgical elements of gesture, text, environment and music. The two books we use during Mass are the **Lectionary** (scripture readings) and the **Roman Missal** (prayer texts). Each of those books bears an inspiring **Introduction** which includes instructions for the prayer of the Church. *The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy* is the first document published by the Second Vatican Council. In addition, we rely on the U.S. bishops' beautiful document *Sing to the Lord*.

These documents are much more than dry, boring prescriptions for who does what when. Rather, they are full of edifying assertions that the public prayer of the Church has the power to evangelize, to encourage the faithful, to strengthen those who are weak; that art is a gift from God; that our singing is pleasing to God who created us.

In these documents, we read that the Church's preference is for the ritual elements to be sung, either a formally composed song or a simple or elaborate chant: Introductory Rites, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of the Eucharist, Concluding Rites. The Church presumes that every word we pray aloud will be sung. For pastoral reasons, we can choose to recite some of our prayer.

The **Three Judgments** (Musical, Liturgical, and Pastoral) govern choices for all the music sung during Mass. The *Musical Judgment* considers the art of the piece of music in question: is it good music? is it worthy for Sunday worship? The *Liturgical Judgment* considers whether this music fits the liturgical action, whether it reflects the scripture readings and the texts of the Roman Missal. The *Pastoral Judgment* asks whether this music expresses the prayer of this parish.

United with One Voice

The principle of **Progressive Solemnity** suggests that those elements which are more important should be given more attention, while less important elements should recede. When we're talking about the liturgical art of music, one way to give more attention to a liturgical text or action is to sing.

For instance, the high point of the Liturgy of the Eucharist is the Holy Holy Holy preceding the Eucharistic Prayer, when the earthly choir (all of us) joins the heavenly choirs of angels gathered around the throne of God. The Church tells us that if anything is sung, the Holy must be sung. During the Liturgy of the Word, the proclamation of the Gospel is the high point; for this reason, if the Alleluia is not sung, it is to be omitted.

Therefore, if anything during Mass is sung, the Gospel Acclamation and the Holy should be sung. And if the Alleluia and the Holy are not sung, we are instructed that *nothing should be sung*.

This is a situation unlikely to arise at Saint Julie on a Sunday. But imagine a parish with limited resources deciding: "We're pretty good singers, so some Sunday when we don't have an accompanist or a cantor, we'll just sing the Entrance Song and then a song at the end. We'll recite everything else." It would be better for that imaginary parish, guided by the Principle of Progressive Solemnity, to choose to sing only the Gospel Acclamation and the Holy.

The Church also has something to say about style of music or which instruments are permitted or forbidden. With regard to style, all styles are permitted, and Gregorian chant is to be preserved. Over the years, Saint Julie has periodically included these ancient chants in our repertoire so that we may sing them confidently and so that each new generation can learn them.

With regard to instruments, no instrument is forbidden, and therefore, any instrument is permitted.

Sometimes music accompanies the ritual action. For example, the song for Communion lasts as long as the procession lasts; it accompanies the rite. **Other times music is the ritual action.** For example, when we sing the Gloria, nothing else is happening; the Gloria is the rite.

The Entrance Song is a hybrid of rite and rite-accompanying; its purposes are fourfold: to open the celebration, to foster unity within the assembly, to announce the feast, and to accompany the ministerial procession.

There is never a time during Mass when music is a break in the action or an interruption. Because recorded music is everywhere in our world, this can be a tricky thing to understand. Recorded music is (1) usually passive and (2) often a thing to be purchased, a commodity. But in Catholic ritual, music is neither passive nor can it be obtained. *Ritual music can only be made. By us.*

But what about those of us who don't have good voices or who can't sing?

Even those people should sing. God gave you your voice and God does only good work. Your voice was given to you by God so that you could praise God. God gave us grapes and wheat so that we could make wine and bread, so that we would have something to offer to God in sacrifice. This same wine and bread, fruit of the earth, work of human hands, becomes Christ's blood and body, offered by the priest *in persona Christi*, which we share in communion.

Add your voice to the singing. If you sing a little bit, you will encourage the person next to you to sing a little bit. We each sing just a little bit, and our collective contributions add up to a mighty sound: God's people, united with one voice, singing God's praises.

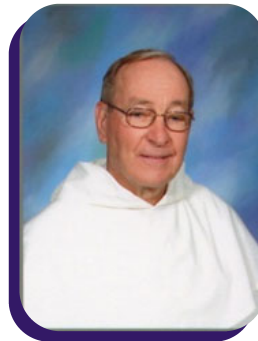
Domestic Violence Outreach

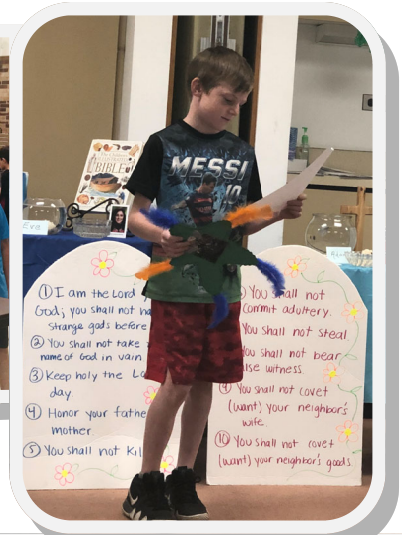
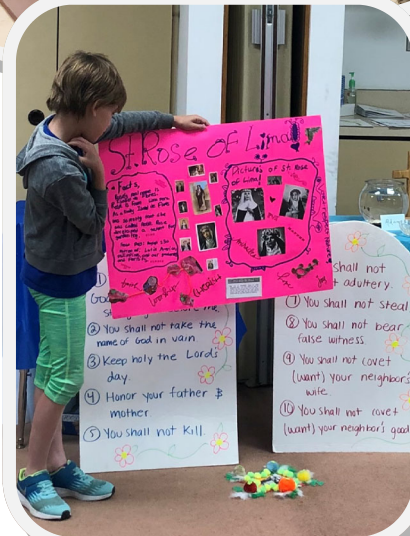

Are you registered and considered an active parishioner?

Many people believe that they are parishioners when, in fact, they have never registered. We need to have you in the parish rolls for mailings, both postal and email (if applicable). We desire to have good contact information in the case of an emergency such as an anointing or death.

In theory, any soul who resides in the canonical boundaries of a parish is considered a parishioner. However, today, many parishioners reside beyond the given canonical boundaries. What then does it mean to be an active parishioner? Here are some guidelines used in the distinction of "active parishioner."

An "active parishioner" is defined as someone who is properly registered. Adult children living at home are

strongly encouraged to register separately from their parents as parishioners.

An "active parishioner" attends Mass regularly on Sundays and Holy Days.

An "active parishioner" participates in a ministry of the Church.

An "active parishioner" supports the parish through sacrificial giving either via envelope or online giving.

An "active parishioner" participates in parish activities whenever possible.

The above criteria help us to testify to one's suitability to serve as a godparent for Baptism or sponsor for Confirmation.

Registration can be started online via stjulie.org or visiting the Parish Office during normal business hours.

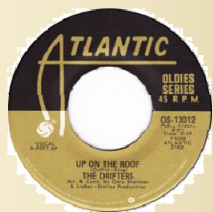

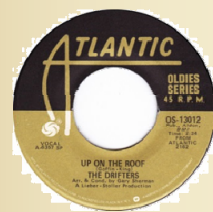
