LABOR DAY

Summer is unofficially over. Sorry to start with the bad news, but we traditionally call Labor Day Weekend the end of summer. I suppose in some ways it is fitting to think this way. As the academic year kicks into gear, the fun of summertime, vacations and more restful times dissipate. Nevertheless, the focus of Labor Day is not to end summer, but it is rather to uphold the dignity of labor/work.

Created by the growing labor movements of the 19th Century, Labor Day became an official national holiday in 1894. The Church has long been a champion of the dignity of work recognizing that we are all called to share our God given talents for the production of society in ways that are just, fair and respectful of human dignity. Popes such as Pope Leo XIII and St. John Paul II have written important Encyclical Letters about the dignity of work. Pope Leo XIII wrote in 1891 the Encyclical *Rerum Novarum* ('of New Things') in which he promoted the rights of workers to organize, called for better working conditions for those who labor, challenged both socialism and unrestricted capitalism, and called for cooperation between governments and their citizens. One hundred years later, St. Pope John Paul II published his Encyclical *Centesimus annus* ('The Hundreth Year') affirming the teachings from Pope Leo's ground breaking encyclical and highlighting again the responsibility of governments to be guarantors of human rights through social and economic justice. Today, we still have many challenges which confront the dignity of workers and the well-being of society as whole.

As we observe Labor Day, may it serve as an ongoing reminder that there is still much to be done to promote the dignity of work; there are still far too many who are unemployed or underemployed, who work in adverse conditions, who suffer unjust wages, who feel their dignity lessened. Labor Day is not to 'end' something (i.e. summer) rather it is a reminder to begin a new the great tasks of building a more just world through the grace and respect of all who 'labor.'

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE CARE FOR CREATION

A hallmark of the papacy of Pope Francis is the commitment to care for God's creation. From the very start of serving as pope, Francis has expressed a commitment to challenge the citizens of the world to better appreciate and care for earth where we are blessed to live. Beginning in 2015, the World Day of Prayer for Care of Creation was instituted by Pope Francis as an annual reminder to us of this vital task for our world to be celebrated on September 1.

In his Encyclical *Laudato Si* ('Praise Be to You') the Holy Father walks through many of the challenges to the planet and the subsequent impact upon our societies if we fail to act in way that we "care for our common home." Beyond praying for a better world, what are concrete steps that can be taken by each of us to better clean our environment and respect the gift of the land we live upon? Just recently, I was driving to a meeting in the pouring rain and the car in front of me rolled down their window to throw trash out! In the pouring rain! I thought, how crazy it is to think of the world as a garbage can, but how much more crazier it must be to want to get soaking wet in order to pollute the world and keep the inside of your car clean. And it wasn't just a small wrapper that was tossed out the window.

Today, as we observe this Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, let us remember how precious and valuable our world. Let us redouble any and all efforts we make in promoting a more sustainable and earth friendly environment. It is then that we can join both St. Francis of Assisi and Pope Francis is praising God for the gift of creation.

Dear Padre,

Life seems to be an endless grind of work, family responsibilities, and more work? Can you help me find meaning in my work?

You've hit upon one of life's great mysteries! We struggle to make sense out of our work, our pain, and our joy. There's no simple answer to your question, but let's begin by looking at nature.

Leaves fall when autumn presages winter. Cold winds howl, and spring eventually refreshes us before the summer swelter envelops us. Again and again, one season must "die" before the next one gives life. A similar process happens within us. Our work, tears, and lonely times are part of a cycle of death and rebirth. Like the changing seasons, these open us to new growth.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* says: "Work honors the Creator's gifts and the talents received from him. It can also be redemptive. By enduring the hardships of work...[we] collaborate in a certain fashion with the Son of God in his redemptive work" (CCC 2427). Christ went this way before us, and he will be with us in our difficulties.

Work can be difficult, hectic, and sometimes seem senseless. But we can

trust that Christ is present in these ups and downs. We can let go of anxiety and say, "Jesus, I trust you are with me now, in this moment of work or pain, and that together we will get through this."

May you find hope this Labor Day weekend amid your struggles through the wonderful journey of life.



WHAT'S IN IT FOR ME?

It starts from the moment we are born. When we have a need, we cry and the need gets filled. Our brains begin to make the connection. As we get older, we learn that bringing attention to ourselves will take the focus off others and put it on us. And then the connections start to go deeper. We realize that not just our physical needs get fulfilled, our psychological needs get fulfilled as well. How *those* needs are met are responsible for how our self-image develops and eventually determines what kind of people we turn out to be.

The vast majority of us grow into pretty well adjusted adults who have just enough self-interest that our psyches are normal and we have enough compassion to understand that society does not revolve around our needs exclusively. But, there are a minority of individuals whose psychological development never matures beyond the self centered stage. They are the ones whose motives never go deeper than "what's in it for me."

I have been fortunate in my life that I have run into only a few of them. But, I recall one such person where I was employed at a construction company many, many years ago. He was a job estimator. It was his responsibility to look over every construction job and estimate how much it would cost for materials and man hours. He then passed on that information to our owner who would put together a proposal for the customer. I was only in my twenties when I worked there and had not

spent much time around people who weren't family or close friends. So I took it for granted that everyone was as kind and considerate as they were. But I was mistaken.

After several months it became obvious that there was an 'angle' to everything the estimator did. And the bottom line to the angle was how much he could personally benefit by his recommendations. The customer's needs or the good of the company never even appeared on his radar. It was all about his own advancement. I suspect that had he been at the dinner Jesus was attending, he would have been one of the people choosing a place of honor.

I do not know what happened to this man early in his life that caused this disconnect between seeing his own needs balanced by the needs of others. I only know that now it would take a tremendous amount of self-examination for him to change his attitude and actions in the world. But, it might be possible if he placed total faith in God.

That's hard enough to do when you are a well adjusted individual but extremely difficult if your focus has always been on yourself. That's why it is so important to establish a connection to a strong faith community. It's only through a relationship with others that we come to understand our proper place in relation to everyone else. As that becomes clearer, our willingness to put their needs first will take root in our hearts. It is only then that "what's in it for me" becomes "what's in it for US" and the gifts of God will flow through us and out into the world for all to share.

READINGS FOR THE TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: Sirach 3: 17-18, 20, 28-29

Conduct your affairs with humility.

- Today's first reading gives us the wisdom of Ben Sira, a second century Jerusalem sage, who gives a dramatic lesson on humility.
- The final verses introduce a favorite subject of Ben Sira, the giving of alms.

Reading II: Hebrews 12: 18-19, 22-24a

You have drawn near to the city of the living God.

- In today's reading from Hebrews the image of the Israelites at Mount Sinai is colored with details from the book of Exodus and other Old Testament passages.
- The fearful aspects of the old covenant experience are emphasized in contrast to the picture of Mount Zion. Christians, however, do not live in fear of imitating the Old Testament failures, we have the advantage of the person of Jesus, who sealed the new covenant in his own blood.

Gospel: Luke 14: 1, 7-14

Whoever exalts self shall be humbled and whoever humbles self will be exalted.

- Luke presents a scene with Jesus in the home of a Pharisee.
- Jesus addresses the guests with a parable that warns against self-exaltation and points out that the kingdom is for everyone, and our hospitality is to embrace all, especially those who are overlooked.

Classes begin this week. We are now in the process of finalizing classes and recruiting catechists, so it is important for new and returning families to register as soon as possible.

It's not too late to register. We accept cash or check. Credit card payments or direct debit from your checking or savings account are only available on-line, through *Faith Direct*.

Our Religious Education program is for children in Preschool thru the 8th grade, who attend the public district schools. This program is developmental, which means that the children are expected to attend ALL levels in order to be fully initiated and formed into the life of the Church.

Am I eligible to attend Cardinal Bernardin School? Where is it located?

CJB is a “regional” Catholic school (sponsored by four parishes: St. Francis of Assisi, St. Julie Billiart, St. Stephen Deacon & Martyr, and St. Elizabeth Seton). CJB also welcomes children from other parishes and households whose parents are seeking a Christ-centered educational environment. Please share this news with your neighbors and friends! CJB is located at 9250 W. 167th Street in Orland Hills, adjacent to St. Elizabeth Seton Parish.

Do you offer Pre-K and Kindergarten?

Yes! We offer half-day and full-day 3-year-old and 4-year-old Pre-K! Kindergarten is full-day. The half-day 3PK program is Monday-Thursday. You would select either 7:40am-10:40am(AM) or 11:40am-2:40pm (PM). Half-day 4PK is Monday-Friday (select AM or PM). Full-day Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten are Monday-Friday. Full-day hours are 7:40am-2:40pm.

Where and when may I get registration materials? How do I register?

Registration opened in January and continues until all spaces are filled. To register, complete the 2019-2020 online application at www.cjbschool.org and then mail or drop off *original* birth and baptismal certificates (*originals will be returned*) and a one-time family enrollment fee of \$250. For Grades 1-8, include a copy of the 2018-19 first semester report card and standardized test scores.

What is the tuition and how do I pay?

Tuition for 2018-19 is as follows; anticipate a slight increase for 2019-2020. Full-day (Kindergarten-8) in-parish tuition is \$5,195. Full-day tuition for 3PK and 4PK is \$5,510. Half-day 3PK tuition is \$2,970. Half-day 4PK tuition is \$3,525. (Non-parishioner tuition is \$6,075 for Grades K-8). Tuition payment plans are available.

What about Financial Assistance?




