## OPENING UP

On Friday, May 1, Governor Pritzker announced that in the amended stay-at-home order, religious services are deemed as essential services. Indeed, they are essential to us all and gratefully we have been able to carry on in some fashion through the use of media. Nevertheless, there is a longing by many to physically come to Mass, to receive the Eucharist and to experience God's mercy in the Sacrament of



Reconciliation. As priests, Fr. Ton and I long for that day, too. As you know, we are simply not able to 'flip the switch' allowing for things to resume as in the past. The Archdiocese is working on a coordinated plan to implement across all the parishes and agencies. I can assure you that as quickly and as prudently as we can we will participate in this resumption of 'in person' services. Perhaps by next week's bulletin, we will have received the guidance on the next steps. Of course, each of these steps will require us to assess our own capabilities as a parish and much thinking is already taking place in that regard. For now, we continue to pray for God's grace to heal us and free us from this pandemic. We also pray for the wisdom and guidance of the Holy Spirit that we may go forward with security and confidence.

## A SIGH OF RELIEF

As a pastor, my first concern is always the pastoral care of the people entrusted to me. It has been a struggle, but I am hopeful that with the help of many, St. Julie has been able to provide pastoral care during this unprecedented time, although probably far from perfect. Pastoral care is always a priority of heart. That being said, I've had numerous sleepless nights worrying about the temporal matters of 'running' the parish. We have, for the most part, been able to weather the storm financially because of your great generosity. I am pleased to share the news that St. Julie Billiard Church qualified and received funds from the CARES Act through the Payment Protection Program. After being shut out in the first round and multiple anxiety-filled days in applying during the second round, we have confirmation of the loan and the monies deposited in our account. This means that we have avoided the furloughing of any of our employees. This is a great help to our financial well-being, as it covers not only salaries for the next eight weeks, but also utility expenses as well. There is a long rode to recovery on many fronts, but at least on this one, I/we can breathe a little sigh of relief.



## HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY!

I think in every culture there is deep love for family expressed in different ways. Normally, for Vietnamese, and I can only speak from my experience, we are very family oriented. Though we don't express our emotions much through words in daily conversation, we usually do it through actions, songs, or writing letters. For example, Nguyen Van Chung, a Vietnamese composer, wrote "Nhật Ký Của Mẹ/ Mom's Diary" in 2008 as a birthday gift to his mother. I think this song captures well the love of a mother to her child. As we are celebrating Mother's Day, imagine that I am singing this song as a gift to all mothers out there:

1. *"Many days I've been looking, many days I've been waiting. Many days I've been long for your birth. Inside me, was there laughter of a growing infant? Suddenly I wake up, and I see my tiny angel. Hearing your cry, my eyes blurred with tears. Thank you for coming to my life.*

*[Chorus 1] My beloved, do you know? I love you, love you the most. Look at you, on your crib. Look at your wide eyes. Oh my dear, here's your father, he's so happy. With tear on his face, look at him, he's crying.*

2. *One day I wake up, then, I hear. You are babbling a sound: "Mama!" Such unexpected word from your tiny lip, my heart explodes with happiness. This is earth; this is sky; this is the place where you were born. With your tiny feet walking behind your dad, it's your first step in your life.*

*[Chorus 2] My beloved, do you know? I love you, love you so much. Keep walking, I'm here watching your every steps. One day, when you're grown up, life may not be how you expected. Just remember to rise up and keep walking.*

3. *Your first day of class, I walk with you to school. Hesitantly, you walk behind me. In a late summer, the cicadas sing the welcome song. The sun ray guides your way to school. Day after day, you become more familiar with your school. Your friends, your teachers love you. My little one, you're always a good child. It gives me never-ending joy.*

*[Chorus 3] My beloved, do you know? I love you, love you so much. There are many nights watching you*

*study late. It makes my heart ache so much. Each exam comes and goes. Your childhoods will past really fast. Wishing my child will have a successful life.*

4. *One day, I see your random smile; and the rose, hiding under your table; and the unpolished letter, with the strange name; it must be someone you care very much for. One day, I see your uneasy feeling; the rose still under the table; the leaf still not wilted; and the flower still not withered; then why are you so languished?*

*[Chorus 4] My beloved, do you know? I love you, love you so much. Memories of your first love won't fade away so easily. But, the moon will warm you. After the rain, here comes the sun. Someone will love you even more than me.*

5. *One day you grow up, one day you mature. One day, you must go on and leave me. With steady step, no trouble can stop you. Wide sea and high sky are ready for your glory. Someday it's hot and someday it's rain. Someday, I miss you so much; I miss your presence; I miss your smile; I miss you with every seconds of my life.*

*[Chorus 5] My beloved, do you know? I love you, love you the most. At (your) faraway place/ Don't worry, I'm still happy. Every letters contains my love for you. With beautiful cloud, I send to you my embracing hugs. Wish you forever happy and be at peace.*

6. *Many days I've been looking, many days I've been waiting. Many days I've been long for your return. Many days, many months, I've been dreamed. I've been dreamed about my innocent little child, beside me. Suddenly I wake up, and I see. My child, you're still my little angel. Hearing your cry, my eyes blurred with tears. It is beautiful, isn't it? Hope you experience this mother love growing up in one way or another. We lift our love to our mothers in prayer.

This month of May, as we are honoring Mary, please keep in mind that she is a mother of every child. Echoing from my last Sunday homily, as Jesus is the gate of the Sheep – leading us to heaven where we can see God face to face and experience the most beautiful / awe-filled / happiest moment we could ever imagine. Mother Mary did experience heaven on

earth. Why? Mary is the gate for Christ to enter the world; and therefore, it makes her the easiest, shortest, and most perfect way for us to get to Christ in order to enter through the gate.

In Mary's life, she recognized her life is full of grace and she wanted to magnify it patiently. For example, at the Incarnation, she opened her womb to welcome Christ (Is it joyful? Yes, but she suffered as well as she was just betrothed to Joseph); at the nativity, she opened her womb again to let Christ enter the world (Is it joyful? Yes, but the pain and suffering that she endured was huge); at the crucifixion, she opened her entire being (As a mother, how much pain and suffering we see in her, yet, she had hope in the resurrection); and therefore, at the end of Mary's life, God crowned/enthroned her with the honor of being a mother to every child.

Mary, cause of our joy – pray for us.

## MOTHER'S DAY WISHES


Happy Mother's Day to every woman who ever had the privilege to love a child unconditionally.

### Liturgy of the Word

#### 1st Reading

*A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles*

As the number of disciples continued to grow, the Hellenists complained against the Hebrews because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution. So the Twelve called together the community of the disciples and said, "It is not right for us to neglect the word of God to serve at table. Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the word."

The proposal was acceptable to the whole community, so they chose Stephen, a man filled with faith and the Holy Spirit, also Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicholas of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these men to the apostles who prayed and laid hands on them. The word of God continued to spread, and the number of the disciples in Jerusalem increased greatly; even a large group of priests were becoming obedient to the faith.



## What Is God Really Like?

**T**hat is a very profound question, asked by children and adults alike. Answers range from the image of an old man in a white robe with a beard; the all-seeing eye on the back of the dollar bill; “the big guy” up there. Such answers seem frivolous when we think about the dynamic force behind the Big Bang from which evolved everything in the billions of galaxies that we know exist. What is such a God really like?


### FOR *Reflection*

- ★ Why do you suppose you think of God in that way?

The disciples were probably not thinking of astrophysics when they asked Jesus about God. Their questions flowed from Jesus’ constant reference to God as Father. That title in itself tells us something about God. It tells us that God, like a father, is the source of Jesus’ being and existence.

In today’s Gospel, Jesus tells the disciples that he is about to return to his Father. He also assures them that they also will have a place with the Father. However, like us, they still are not sure what this Father is like. Jesus responds to their lack of understanding and suggests: “Look at me!” His life is lived for others. He is one who cares for those in need rather than walks past them, who forgives rather than condemns, who endures misunderstanding without retaliating, who tolerates the pettiness of others without being snide. Why is it so hard for us to realize that *this* is what God is really like?

# Dear Padre,

## Are there models I can use to help me better understand what a mother is to do or be?

**A** great model for mothers is the Blessed Virgin Mary. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* uses the titles of Advocate, Helper, Benefactress, and Mediatrix when speaking of Mary (CCC 969). These titles are important in explaining Mary's special relationship to us, her children. We can also use these titles to show how mothers today can relate to their children and spouses.

Mary encourages us in our efforts to follow Christ. So it is the duty of all mothers to be a guiding presence to their children as they begin to pray and learn to follow the Lord.

As Advocate and Helper, Mary assists us by her own prayer and example. Mary prays for us, and we only have to read Scripture to understand Mary's example of listening to God. Today's mothers share the task of praying for their children and spouses. A mother's example of listening for God can teach her children the importance of seeking God's will.

As Benefactress, Mary is a patron and invites us to receive the graces that only her Son can bestow. In today's family, a mother offers a constant stream of love and encouragement to her spouse and children. She is the patron of love, a refuge from the harshness that life can bring.

As Mediatrix, Mary brings people together to be coworkers with Christ in the work of salvation. Also, a mother is a mediator, a coworker with Christ, helping her children and spouse on their journeys toward salvation. Her family is a little church where heaven and salvation are proclaimed.
