## TRINITY SUNDAY

This first Sunday after Pentecost is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity and returns the Church to Ordinary Time in the Liturgical Calendar. Whereas most of the feasts that mark our calendar reference moments in the life of Jesus or one of the Saints, or Mary, this celebration is an “idea” feast that invites

us to dwell on the mystery of God’s revelation to us as the Trinity. God has been revealed as Father, Son and Holy Spirit; one God but in a trinity of persons. God is always infinitely more than our minds can comprehend, yet to personalize the divine relationship that is desired by God with us, this revelation aids us in seeing and knowing God. The Father sent the Son to save us and continues to reveal God’s love for us in the Holy Spirit. We may still struggle to fully comprehend the mystery of God. Yet, today’s feast encourages us to come closer to relating to this wonderful God who gives life and sustains us.

## NEW PASTOR

As I mentioned last Sunday, Fr. Tirso Villaverde has been appointed the next pastor of St. Julie Billiard. Fr. Tirso is coming to St. Julie from serving as pastor of St. Margaret Mary on the north side of Chicago. I have spoken extensively with Fr. Tirso about St. Julie and I’m sure there will be many more conversations in the future as his and my transitions take shape. I have known Fr. Tirso since 1989, the year I transferred into the College Seminary. We graduated from College together and then four years later we were ordained together in 1996 (see the picture below of the two of us from ordination day). As long as I have known Fr. Tirso, I have seen him as a man of prayer who is



kind and generous. I am confident that you will welcome him and come to love him as your pastor. Welcome Fr. Tirso!



## RACIAL TENSIONS

We are all well aware of the violence that plagues our streets in a response to the death of George Floyd in Minnesota. Peaceful demonstrations devolved into violent clashes with rioting and looting. Many more people were hurt. The stain of the sin of racism still plagues our nation. It is a sin we must account for in our own lives and collectively as society. Violence is not the answer and quite frankly overshadows the necessary civil discourse that is needed to teach us to move in a better direction. #ALL LIVES MATTER – Black lives are as valuable as Blue lives. When we get beyond the labels which divide, and see each other as God sees us – that we are all children of God – it is then that we can take the steps together for a brighter, safer and more just future. I pray that we can all seek the way of peace and respect for one another.

## REOPENING OF THE PARISH

We are moving forward with the reopening of the parish as both society in general and the Church in specific take the steps of returning life to a semblance of normalcy. The last several months have been difficult on us in so many ways. However, the precautions that we took were necessary and now the precautions we will take in reopening are just as necessary. The COVID-19 Pandemic is still with us. That is why we must be prudent, purposeful and patient with the process of reopening. Although this weekend marks a return to in-person celebrations of the Mass, it does not mean that these celebrations are without needed safety measures to continue mitigating the spread of the virus. I must emphasize that despite our best efforts to provide a clean and safe environment for prayer, your willingness to come to Church can expose you to someone who may be asymptomatic with the virus. Everyone places themselves at risk the moment they leave their home to go to the store, to work and now back to church. **Anyone who has any feeling of sickness, such as a temperature, should STAY HOME!** All Catholics in the Archdiocese continue to be dispensed from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass; this dispensation is granted by Cardinal Cupich indefinitely until it is safe to return to public worship.

We will continue livestreaming Sunday Mass at 9:30am to allow folks to continue to pray with us.

Currently, the Parish is reopened for the following:

- ◆ The Sacrament of Reconciliation on Thursday evening from 6:00-7:00pm and Saturday morning from 9:00-10:00am.
- ◆ Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on Thursday morning from 8:30am-11:00am.
- ◆ Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals are also now available.

This weekend, we begin Sunday Mass, although we are only celebrating Mass at 4:30pm on Saturday afternoon and Sunday morning at 9:30am. We have a great group of volunteers that serve on the Set-up Team, Greeting Team and Cleaning Team that are required for ANY and ALL public prayer celebrations. We want to verify the procedures we've put in place are adequate for maintaining the safe environment we envision. Again, this is a gradual process and so I once again ask for your patience and cooperation.

Please note there are some general guidelines that everyone **must** adhere to in this process such as:

- You must wear a mask to enter the parish buildings and the mask must be worn throughout the services.
- Social distancing must be maintained at all times; this requires folks to sit in designated pews/chairs which are not to be moved.
- Communion is to be received only in the hand and will be offered only as the Precious Body of the Lord.

There is much additional guidance for each of these moments of prayer that we are now opening up for. Please make sure you read the guidelines that are posted on the website [stjulie.org](http://stjulie.org).

We've been going through this challenging time together and will continue to do so. We do not want to lose any of the gains we have made in fighting the spread of the virus so your cooperation is key to our successful reopening.

## **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**

Volunteers are needed to assist with various aspects of our parish reopening plan. Importantly, leadership team members and volunteers must not be part of a "vulnerable population" (that is, not over the age of 65; no underlying medical condition such as diabetes; lung disease; undergoing cancer treatment, etc.). If you are younger than 65 and healthy with no underlying health conditions to consider assisting with one of the reopening teams:

- **Set-up team.** Sample duties include ensuring that all supplies needed for each sacramental celebration/gathering are ready for use, entrances and exits are marked and propped physically open prior to attendees' arrival/departure, windows are opened, etc.
- **Greeting team.** Sample duties include assisting in managing the flow of congregants as they enter the church, making sure attendees use hand sanitizer upon entering, are wearing a mask, and are reminded not to enter if ill; directing people to appropriate seating/waiting areas, etc.
- **Cleaning team.** Sample duties include maintaining and cleaning essential and trafficked areas of the church before and after the church has been used. Masks and gloves will be provided, if you do not have your own, in addition to approved cleaning/disinfecting supplies.



# THE STUMP OF JESSE

## APOSTLE VERSUS DISCIPLE?

South, North, East, and West, people are panicking and running in different directions because of the raging fire. That scene in an action movie can easily frighten the audience. Yet, that fire does not burn nor can it cook anything because it is only an image of a fire. We often say to one another, we should set the world on fire by our faith. That is a good start to begin with but is our faith really burning, as a real fire that ignites the world or is it just a mere image?

Lately, I have received mixed information about reopening the parish: some people are excited and cannot wait to get back to the Church; others have some hesitation due to their health and different concerns; some have developed a habit of watching Mass at home and don't want to break that comfy routine; some don't see the difference of having or not having the faith so they give up; some have more curiosity about the faith and ask random questions such as what is the difference between Apostle and Disciple?

I will respond to the last reaction and hopefully shed some light on the previously listed reactions. The English word "apostle" is derived from the Greek *apostello*, "to send forth" while "disciple" is derived from the Latin *discipulus*, meaning a "student" or "pupil." With this understanding, an apostle is someone who "is sent" to preach the Gospel to the world and a disciple is a person who is constantly learning what it means to be a Christian. Twelve disciples are also called apostles because they followed Jesus, learned from Him, were trained by Him, and were sent by Him to the world to preach the Gospel after the Pentecost. You might say, "well, I have some of that in

me, does it mean I am a disciple and an apostle?"

Oh yes! Cardinal Thuan once said, "the faithful of the early Church commonly described the apostle as a person with Christ in his heart, in his whole demeanor, in his speech, in his actions and even in his own body. In a word, an apostle is one filled with Christ and spends his life transmitting Christ to others." So, brothers and sisters in Christ, no matter where we are at - home, school, work, in the church, etc. - we should let the apostleship and discipleship burn brightly in our hearts and ignite others through our words and deeds. Is it easy to let that fire in us become extinguished? Yes, it is easy. Is it easy to get that fire ignited? Well, it requires some perseverance. However, once it burns, no one can stop it because it is filled with Christ.

In short, let every moment of our lives be a flash of fire, the fire of our duty, of our obedience and of our patience. Such a flame will burn brightly to illuminate the world doing Jesus' Great Commission, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

## Three in One, or One in Three?

**O**ur thinking moves far from the reality of God when we limit our reflection of the Trinity to numbers. The characterizations of an old man, a younger man, and a dove do not help much either. However, these are attempts to somehow talk about the mystery of all mysteries. We cannot adequately conceptualize or characterize God, but we try. Each reading today makes its own attempt.

In the Exodus passage, God actually describes God's own self: "gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in love and fidelity" (Exodus 34:6).

The Gospel passage tells us how these divine features play out in our lives: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son" (John 3:16). This Son is God in the flesh. What greater love can there be?

The prayer in Paul's letter seems to scoop us up


like an adoring parent would into the embrace of the Trinity: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the holy Spirit be with all of you" (2 Corinthians 13:13).

**T**heologians tell us that each person of the Trinity interacts with us and the rest of the created universe in a way unique to each person. Though different, each way is an expression of self-emptying love. The only response required of us is openness to that love. God only asks that we accept that love and allow it to transform us. Then we will be the living example of the Trinity's love for all.

## BEFORE YOU ARRIVE



Check your temperature: if you have one, please do not come to church.



Stay home if you are ill.



Make sure you have a face covering to bring and wear.



Remember to bring your registration if you are not already on a list of attendees.



# PARISHIONER REOPENING GUIDE Page 2

## WHEN YOU ARRIVE



Enter only in marked doorways.



Wait patiently to be checked in by greeter.



Keep your face covering or mask on at all times except for receiving Communion.



Sanitize your hands as directed by greeter.



Observe social distancing at all times (look for marks on the floor).



Ushers will direct you to pews with markings showing where to sit.



Since there will be no passing of baskets for your offering please leave your offering in the boxes provided at the entrance and exit areas.

## DURING THE SERVICE



Do not change seats during a service.



There will be no passing of offering baskets.



No physical sign of peace will be exchanged during Mass.



Follow instructions for Communion:

- Leave your seat only when directed by usher or greeter.
- Maintain six feet social distancing in the Communion line – look for marks on the floor.
- When 12 feet or two people away from the priest, sanitize your hands using the sanitizer from the usher. After sanitizing do not touch any surfaces.
- Approach the priest only after you are called forward. DO NOT remove your face covering.
- Extend a single hand to receive the Host.
- After moving six feet to the right or left, remove your mask and consume the Host.
- Replace your face covering or mask.
- Follow instructions to return to your pew.

## AFTER THE SERVICE



Please take any worship aids you may have brought with you.



You will be dismissed by pew or seating area. Follow the instructions of the greeter or usher.



Use only the designated exit doors.



Do not congregate outside the church doors.



Continue to wear your face covering or mask until you leave the area where worshippers are.



##### A Reading from the Book of Exodus
